

S/S Stockholm




Built in 1931, S/S Stockholm was commissioned by the Swedish Royal Postal Service to operate along one of the country's most hazardous winter routes – between Kalmar and Färjestaden on Öland. Today she is the largest ship in the fleet, with a beautiful dining room, decorated in the Art Deco style of the time. In addition to the spacious dining room, there is also a gentlemen's lounge and a ladies' lounge for smaller and more intimate dinners. The vessel also has a large sundeck with space for 50 people.


